Restrictions Review by Bob Werner

Fall is just around the corner and it will be getting darker earlier please replace the bulbs in your front yard if they are burned out. An unlit yard can create unsafe conditions for pedestrians, children and motorist. This is a restriction for the subdivision that is sometimes overlooked.

If you're considering a yard barn please remem-

ber to first gain documented approval for it, or a fence, pool, or structural addition from the Review and Restrictions Committee to prevent any potential problems after the work has been completed.

Parking issues in Keystone has improved. Please remember that habitual parking on the street, a boat,

trailer of any kind parked in driveway or yard are all Restriction violations.





Please don't park habitually on the street

Check you front yard light fixture.

Winter time Maintenance by Wayne Hutchens

Now is the time to seal your aggregate driveway and sidewalks. This will help seal your surfaces and protect them from the winter salts.

Please move your vehicle from the street when we are expecting three inches of snowfall. At this snowfall depth our contracted snow removal service will be clearing the streets. Your vehicle will prevent him from doing the job we need. When there is vandalism in the community please report the specifics to the sheriffs department. They will document the incident and often times they will increase the patrols in our subdivision. The more they hear from us the more coverage we will get.
